Medico-Legal Fee Schedule

Standard Medico-Legal Report

- £500–£1,500 depending on complexity, documentation volume and injury severity.
- Includes record review, clinical examination (if required) and preparation of a CPR-compliant report.

Hourly Rate for Additional Work

- £250 per hour for further record review, complex case analysis, imaging review, correspondence or any professional time related to the case.
- Charged in minimum increments of 15 minutes.

Part 35 Questions / Written Clarification

- £250 per hour, charged in 15-minute increments.

Supplementary or Addendum Reports

- £250 per hour depending on the volume of new or late documentation and any required reassessment.

Consultation or Re-Examination (Face-to-Face or Remote)

- Included when part of the original report scope.
- Additional assessments requested after the report is completed are charged at £250 per hour plus any applicable clinic room fees.

Travel and National Assessments

- National travel for claimant assessments is available by prior agreement.
- Travel time charged at £250 per hour.
- Reasonable travel expenses (mileage, train, taxi, accommodation if required) are payable by the instructing party.

Court Attendance (In Person or Remote)

- Anything up to 6 hours is charged at £250 per hour.
- Anything beyond 6 hours in a single day is charged at the daily rate of **£1,200**.
- Travel time is charged separately at £250 per hour.
- Cancellations within 72 hours of the hearing are charged at the full daily rate.

Non-Attendance and Late Cancellation Fees

- Missed claimant appointments or cancellations within 48 hours of the scheduled

assessment may be charged at **50% of the anticipated report fee.**

– This charge is payable by the instructing party.

Payment Terms

– Payment is due within 30 days of invoice.

– The instructing party is responsible for all fees irrespective of case outcome or cost recovery.

– Late payments may incur interest under the Late Payment of Commercial Debts (Interest) Act 1998.
